Key messages

- The Government of Rwanda, African Union and UNHCR signed an MOU for Rwanda to host refugee from Libya; targeting immigrants who were fleeing to Europe.
- WVR was tasked to lead WASH in Gashora refugee ٠ reception centre.

Gaps and needs

• The education programme has a funding gap of 200,000 USD to meet the assessed needs.

Response highlights

WATER, SANITATION & HYGIENE

- Supplied clean and potable water to 91,722 Refugee and Host community in Mugombwa and Kigeme refugee Camps.
- Maintained sanitation facilities in Mugombwa and Kigeme Refugee Camps; sanitation facilities in these camps are serving adults and refugees children supported, including an estimated 51% children(UNHCR, June 2018 report).

EDUCATION

• The education sector reached 27,596 refugee children in ECD, Primary and Secondary school. Support was offered in teacher's incentives, school feeding fees and school fees for students in boarding schools in Mugombwa, Kigeme, Kiziba, Gicumbi and Nyabiheke Refugee Camps.


