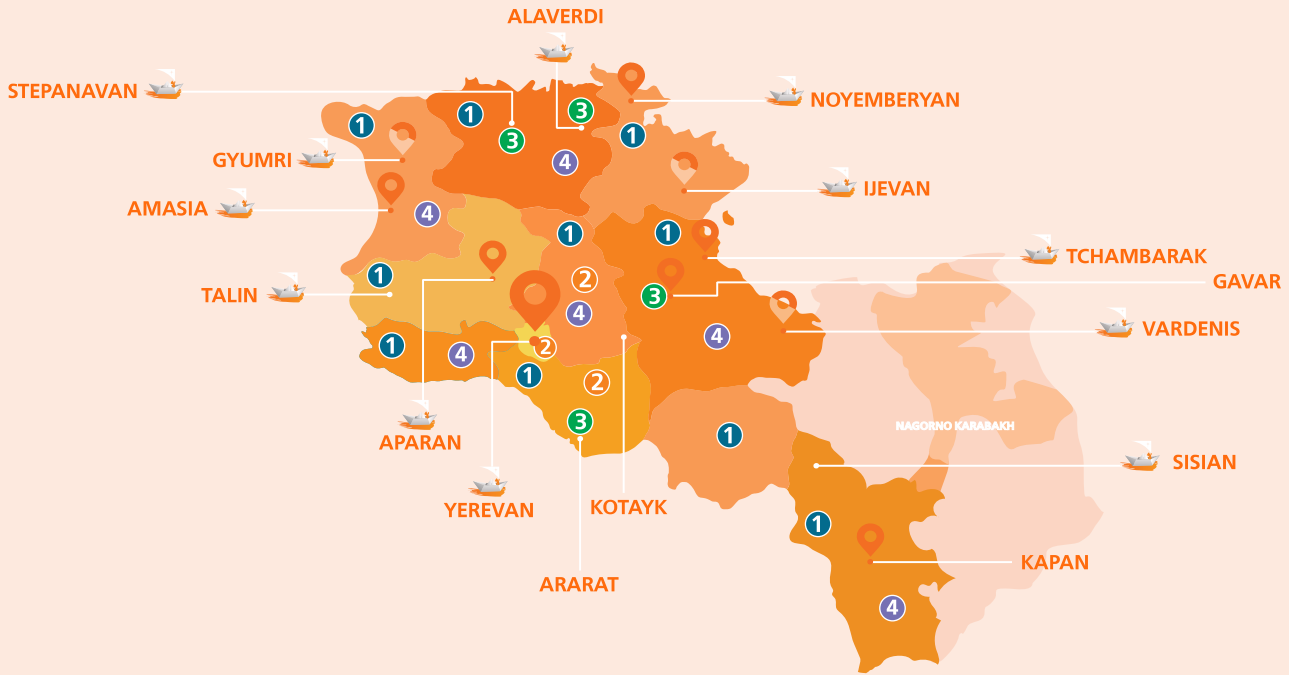



World Vision Armenia Annual Snapshot, 2020

- 3,753 PEOPLE** reached through preventive behavior messaging on COVID-19
- 7,345 PEOPLE** received food packages
- 685 COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS** trained or supported to provide community-based quality services
- RECOMMENDATION PACKAGE** on Emergency preparedness and strategic planning submitted to local and regional authorities.
- 6,145 HYGIENE KITS** distributed
- FAITH LEADERS** disseminated messages on COVID-19 prevention and provided psychological support to the most vulnerable families through online and face-to-face meetings.

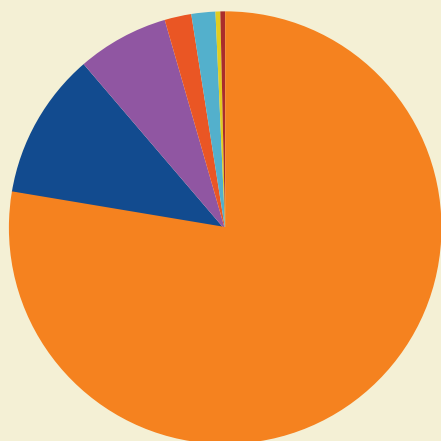
