



WORLD VISION UKRAINE CRISIS RESPONSE in UKRAINE



The humanitarian crisis in Ukraine has caused death, destruction, and displacement of millions of its people. World Vision started responding to the crisis at the borders of Romania and then expanding its assistance to refugees in Georgia, Moldova, and the displaced populations inside Ukraine.

World Vision is working through four overarching programming objectives aiming to reach more than 900,000 people. This will be done through provision of life saving relief assistance, protection, mental health and psychosocial and educational services with

greater funding and design to expand integrated, holistic programs creating greater impact.

Most of World Vision's work will be undertaken through partners. We will focus more on building partner capacity and empowering them to become more self-reliant and efficient in services provision.

World Vision will deliver inclusive, need driven humanitarian assistance to refugees, internally displaced persons and the most vulnerable children and their families in Ukraine, Romania, Moldova, and Georgia.

World Vision started working in Ukraine in March 2022. Offices in Kyiv, Lviv, Dnipro and Chernivtsi currently support aid efforts reaching conflict-affected people in 24 municipalities across Ukraine. Through collaboration with 12 national and international partners, World Vision has been able to deliver live saving assistance to people living near the frontlines while programmes in safer areas support longer term needs of displaced children and families as well as local humanitarian actors.
